

ANNUAL KESAB AWARDS WINNERS CELEBRATED

KESAB was thrilled to be able to hold its annual KESAB awards after Covid delayed the celebrations last year.

The Awards which were held in person at the Mawson Lakes Hotel and also live-streamed celebrated three of KESAB's flagship and long-standing environmental programs, Wipe Out Waste (WOW), the Road Watch Adopt-a-road volunteer program and the Sustainable Communities (formerly Tidy Towns) program.

Wipe Out Waste

KESAB'S successful and long-standing Wipe Out Waste (WOW) program showcased case studies from a diversity of schools including: Tenison Woods College in Mount Gambier, Golden Grove High School, Lady George Kindergarten, Eden Hills Kindergarten and Charles Campbell College & St Michaels College. These schools achieved some amazing results, diverting materials from landfill, educating their broader community and even processing materials on-site as student social enterprises.

KESAB Awards were presented to:

- For Innovation: original projects that show clear and creative thinking, achieving positive outcomes. Winners: Tenison Woods College (Hall of Fame), Charles Campbell College. Special innovation awards to The University of Adelaide & Transmutation.
- For Community: projects that partnered with community to enhance the WOW journey and site sustainability vision. Winner: Golden Grove High School.
- For Culture: whole site inclusion in planning and management of initiatives showing continuous improvement informed by monitoring and communication. Winners: Eden Hills Kindergarten, Elizabeth Grove Primary School & St Michael's College Primary School.

On behalf of the WOW partnership between KESAB and Green Industries SA, we congratulate all the sites who are participating in the WOW program.

With over 50 currently registered groups in the program and more than 560 individuals regularly cleaning litter from their adopted roadsides, KESAB was thrilled to have volunteers and program supporters help celebrate the tremendous positive impact this work has on our roadside amenity, ecosystems, road safety and community wellbeing.

KESAB's Road Watch volunteer roadside litter clean-up program, which is proudly supported by the Department for Infrastructure & Transport, celebrated its 25th birthday in 2021 and this huge milestone was also celebrated at the Awards event with all current Road Watch-Adopt A Road volunteers receiving a Road Watch badge in recognition of their dedication.

"This unique partnership between the department, KESAB and volunteers provides huge and measurable benefits to SA's amenity, community and the environment and KESAB is proud to have been driving this program for 25 years", Ms. Bevan said.

Sustainable Communities

The final awards for the day were for the KESAB's Sustainable Communities awards. This program is the evolution of the KESAB iconic "Tidy Towns' awards and encourages people and communities to create initiatives in their regional towns which provide better places and experiences to live, work and play.

"The Sustainable Communities awards are about celebrating our local communities, and about protecting, conserving, managing, and improving SA for all to enjoy", said Wendy Bevan.

Ms. Bevan said "KESAB was thrilled to once again see a very high caliber of entries for these awards and it was genuinely hard to pick a winner".

At the event, attendees heard of the initiatives from four sustainable communities, The Copper Coast, Karoonda East Murray, Kimba & Murray Bridge.

"These regional communities showed how even in challenging times, people can band together to progress sustainable initiatives. In looking at these initiatives, we noticed a focus on health & wellbeing, likely prompted by the COVID pandemic and we acknowledge the efforts that driving these initiatives take during very challenging times", Wendy Bevan said.

Participants in the Sustainable Community awards were assessed against eight categories.

- 1. Appearance, amenities & facilities
- 2. Community action & partnerships
- 3. Environmental sustainability & education
- 4. Health & wellbeing
- 5. Heritage & culture
- 6. Leadership & youth activities
- 7. Natural environmental management
- 8. Resource recovery, waste management, litter prevention and enforcement



After a very difficult assessment and shortlisting, Sustainable Communities judges visited the two finalists in The Copper Coast & Kimba.
