What is CWMS?

What is really happening!!

There has been a lot said about what is happening to our wastewater in recent months. These discussions have ranged from illegal dumping of septic waste to the installation of a new Community Wastewater Management Scheme (CWMS) for Moonta, Moonta Bay and Port Hughes.

It is true that the EPA and the Department of Health have visited the Copper Coast on numerous occasions and Council is working with them to improve our systems in a number of areas. They have made a number of recommendations; including the construction of a Bio-solids dump site (for septic waste pump out), creating emergency irrigation plans and putting in a full CWMS for the Moonta, Moonta Bay and Port Hughes area.

The Council has completed the new Bio-solids site and is working on numerous other smaller projects that will improve the quality of our wastewater service in the short term.

The full CWMS has been designed, however, its construction will be a discussion point for future workshops and budgets as it will be a project costing tens of millions of dollars.

As this scheme involves pipe work under many roads, the Council is having the pipes installed in preparation for any future system as roads are upgraded. This will avoid the age old problem of having to dig up a newly completed road, and allows us to get on with the program of upgrading our roads.

There is currently a CWMS that covers most of the Wallaroo and Kadina areas, while these systems are old and nearing full capacity they are working well and providing a number of benefits to the community. This year the Council will be constructing a new wastewater treatment plant at Retallick Road. This plant has been designed with expansion in mind and could cater for the Moonta, Moonta Bay and Port Hughes area in the future.

CWMS is an acronym we will all be hearing much more about in the future. This is one problem that we can't just flush away.

Boat Ramp and Trailer Parking Area

The Copper Coast is famous for having some of South Australia's best holiday beaches. Fantastic fishing from boats, beaches, jetties or rocks, amongst some of the most beautiful coastline you will ever see

The Copper Coast has two boat ramps located at Wallaroo and Port Hughes. The fee for the boat ramps is \$5 per day. Tickets are available from the ticket machine, located in the car-park areas of each ramp.

An Annual Permit ticket (1st July to 30th June) can be purchased from the Kadina Council office at a cost of:

\$75 RECREATIONAL permit. \$230 COMMERCIAL permit.

Half Yearly ticket (1st February to 30th June), are also available from the Kadina Council Office.

All permit tickets expire on 30th June. Tickets can be used at any of the 2 boat ramps within the Council area.

All tickets must be displayed either on the dashboard of the towing vehicle or in a prominent, accessible area. If the permit is not displayed when Council inspects the area, a fine may be incurred.

Tickets only need to be purchased if using the boat ramp. General parking is free.

In readiness for the warmer weather and increased boats in the water, District Council of the Copper Coast would like to remind all users no matter how much experience you have; it's always a good idea for everyone to review boating

safety rules before departures.

Boat ramps can be slippery and dangerous - wear appropriate footwear and walk carefully around the boat ramp

Waiting in line at the boat ramp is sometimes a fact of life during peak

times, but when someone blocks a ramp while they load their boat with fishing gear, have problems getting the motor started or experience some other delay, tempers can flair. Please be mindful of other users whilst using the boat ramp facilities.

- Be considerate and tolerant of other users - they may not have your experience or ability. Try passing on some of your knowledge to them, if you feel they need help.
- Be patient it is no use hassling someone having problems as this will probably slow them down
 Offer to help if you can.
- Be prepared it is best to have a helper while launching and retrieving your boat. Having someone available

who can look after the boat while you are driving the vehicle, or vice-versa, will save considerable time.

- All rigging should be completed before you approach the boat ramp.
- On busy days please be aware of other drivers in the parking area.
- All children should be carefully supervised.
- The wash down bay is for washing down of boats only – Please be mindful of any water restrictions that may be in place.
- Please note that the area provided for disabled and emergency vehicle car parks are not 'drop off' points.
- Please place all rubbish and used tackle in the receptacles provided.
- Be aware that divers may be in the area and observe speed limits at all times in the vicinity of dive boats.


Help protect South Australia's valuable fish stocks by adhering to bag, boat and size limits. It is also important to remember that the snapper closure season runs right through November.

The District Council of the Copper Coast would like to remind all residents and visitors to take care and stay safe when using the boat ramp to launch vessels and while on the water.

With the change in weather and the sun starting to shine more often, it is a great chance to explore your local parks and playgrounds and enjoy some time outdoors!





Your event in the park!

Residents must notify Council if they wish to book a rotunda or reserve for a special occasion. Upon notifying Council, an application for a minor special event permit is processed. The application is processed at the Kadina Council office, which incurs a \$30 fee . Event permits assist to reduce double bookings and reduce the potential for disappointment.

When an event is booked through Council, it also enables Council to liaise with its Parks and Gardens staff to ensure the reserve is in great condition for the event. Council requires people to enquire about booking Rotunda's, reserves and foreshore locations for special occasions as the Copper Coast has many beautiful outdoor locations to showcase.

Spending time playing outdoors with your children or grandchildren is a great way to have fun together. With the great parks and playgrounds we have in the Copper Coast, there's the opportunity to do a playground tour – why not try a new one each week or month?

Beachside Holiday Cabin

The District Council of the Copper Coast owns and operates the Wallaroo North Beach Tourist Park and is currently offering opportunities to interested persons to purchase a cabin and occupy a site within the tourist park. The Tourist Park with its beachside location has long been a popular vacation spot for families across the state.

The Council will offer a 5 year license to occupy one of the many cabin sites within the park for an annual license fee. Licensees are then able to use their cabin for their holidays or for their family member's holidays. The tourist park management are able to let out the cabin on behalf of the owner for a management fee.

The Tourist Park has a fish and boat cleaning area, undercover electric BBQ, basketball ring, playground, recreation room and a kiosk. The beach frontage offers safe swimming, excellent fishing and sailing.



The opportunity to have a holiday home with beach frontage does not come along very often. With a low annual license fee and the opportunity to purchase a cabin that suits the needs of you and your family, the Wallaroo North Beach Tourist Park will be the

ideal location of your family beachside holidays into the future.

Active Travel in the Copper Coast

The District Council of the Copper Coast and the Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure are currently working on a Local Government Partnership project titled 'Creating a culture of active travel in the Copper Coast'.

The project aims to increase active travel (e.g. walking and cycling) in the Copper Coast region. The first stage of the project will involve gathering information from both residents and visitors to find out how people are currently travelling in the area and what things might help or hinder them in using more active forms of travel.

The Council will be undertaking consultation with the community throughout October, via an online survey, which will be available via

Council's website. The information collected will feed into a three year active travel plan, where cycling and walking initiatives will be implemented.

Increasing active travel is one of the OPAL Program's 6 goals. The Federal, State and Local Government funded OPAL Program aims to support the Copper Coast community to be active and eat well. OPAL will provide a strong link throughout this project, with Council working in close association with this team on the project.

As a part of the Local Government partnership plan Council will be providing new bike racks throughout the area, implementing a hire bike scheme and developing maps of cycling tracks within the Copper Coast.

Council will also be working in conjunction with Rotary to establish the proposed bike track along the old railway line from Kadina to Wallaroo.

Fire Danger Season 2011/2012

Bushfire Season Dates 15th November 2011 to 30th April 2012

The bushfire season is fast approaching. Council is urging all residents to undertake a general tidy up within and around their home. This includes pruning trees, mowing grasses and cleaning gutters.

With warmer weather rapidly approaching tidying up can also assist to reduce the likelihood of snakes on your property.

The fire danger season for 2011/2012

commences on Tuesday November 15th. During the fire danger season fire restrictions apply throughout the whole state.

Total Fire Bans may be declared on days of extreme weather conditions (high wind and high temperature). These bans will apply for 24 hours, midnight to midnight, and will often be broadcast on radio and television.

Bushfire requirements:

- All grass and undergrowth on a property within the town boundary shall be reduced to a maximum height of 10cm.
- All grass and undergrowth (within 20 metres of buildings and assets) shall be reduced to a maximum

height of 10 centimetres, in rural areas.

 Trees should be pruned to provide a vertical break around buildings.
 Gutters should be cleaned of flammable debris.

If residents are in breach of these conditions fines notices will be issued.



Dog and Cat Management

Dog Registration

All dogs aged three months or over must be registered with your local Council. The purpose of this is to provide quick and easy identification of your dog, should it be found wandering or become lost.

It is an offence for a registered dog not to wear a current registration disc, unless it is confined to the premises occupied by the person responsible for the dog.

New owners have 14 days to register their dog once they take ownership or become responsible for the dog. A fine may be incurred if the dog remains unregistered after the 14 day period.

The registered owner must be a person aged 16 years or over, and that person must notify the Council within 14 days if:

- the dog is moved to different premises;
- the dog dies, or is missing;
- ownership of the dog is transferred to another person.

Owning or keeping an unregistered dog may incur an \$80 expiation fee or a maximum penalty of \$250 imposed by the court. Further penalties can be imposed for every 14 days the dog remains unregistered.

Cat Desexing and Microchipping Program

Following the adoption of Council's Cat By-law, funding was included in the 2010/2011 budget to initiate a cat desexing and microchipping program.

This program was initiated through the two veterinary providers in the Council area throughout June and July this year. A total of 190 individual microchipping/desexing procedures were performed.


