t is an exciting time to see so many projects throughout the Copper Coast progressing, nearing completion or completed. One of the most important is the Wallaroo to Moonta Cycling/Walking Trail.

We have worked with the National Trust of

South Australia and Heritage SA regarding the track travelling through the Moonta Mines Nationally Heritage Listed Precinct. The National Trust considered that there was a significant and important historical mining link in largely following the rail trail from the Moonta Mines to Wallaroo. With funding from the State Open Space Program, State Bike SA Program and Council, the estimated cost is expected to be \$1.5M for the 14.9km track.

The major upgrade of Bay Road from Moonta to Moonta Bay is continuing and also nearing completion. This is a major project not only involving Bay Road, but also the new Cycling/Walking Trail and includes the undergrounding of electricity. Whilst residents living on and around Bay Road have been inconvenienced, it will be a much better road and facility when completed. Last year, Moonta was named as the Top Tourist Town by the Tourism Industry Council South Australia. It is important for the major Road leading from Moonta to Moonta Bay to have this major upgrade.

The stormwater drainage works in George Street, Moonta between Ellen and Henry Streets are continuing. Unfortunately, the excavator used by the Contractor is larger and this has meant that sections of George Street have had to be closed whilst this work is being undertaken. We have tried to undertake the work at a time that has the least inconvenience for traders.

The work on Agery Road also continues to be progressed; but has been delayed as a result of SA Water requirements. This was not planned. The works will be completed as soon as they can.

We continue to undertake the survey and design for the kerb, stormwater and streetscape for the Wallaroo Entrance Road (Copper Coast Highway) from Athena Drive to Irwine Street, Wallaroo. We continue to have meetings with the Department for Infrastructure and Transport in coordinating the works undertaken. Subject to the completion of the survey and design, calling of tenders, awarding of the tender, completion of the contract; the works are expected to commence in February/March 2023.

The Wallaroo Community Development Association are to be congratulated on hosting the Lexus Melbourne Cup in Wallaroo. Wallaroo was the only town outside of Adelaide that the Melbourne Cup travelled to. Congratulations also to the organisers of the Copper Coast Cycling Cup, Copper Coast Show 'n' Shine and 500 Sprints.

We continue to progress a commercial outcome through mediation in relation to the previous Wallaroo Swimming Enclosure. We have lodged an application for funding for a new aquatic facility under the Federal Governments Building Better Regions Fund Round 6. We are awaiting the outcome. Each year we call for applications under our Community Grants Program. We received 47 applications and approved 42. We continue to work with the Kadina Child Care Centre regarding a new Child Care Centre on Doswell Terrace, Kadina near the Dog Park. We continue to work with Moonta Health and Aged Care Service (Parkview Aged Care) regarding the six tiny houses proposal for staff accommodation.

We continue to work with the Copper Coast Lifestyle Village in relation to their proposed extension on Crown Land under the Care and Control of Council. We are undertaking consultation on this proposal, will consider the submissions received and Council will make a recommendation to the State Minister as to whether part of the Crown Land should be used for this extension.

We have worked with the Moonta Progress Association and Moonta Lions Club who have developed a Masterplan for Polgreen Park at Moonta. We appreciate the work they undertake and continue to work with them for grant funding opportunities to progress this Masterplan. We are also progressing a project to possibly drought proof the Moonta Golf, Cricket, Football Clubs and Moonta Cemetery. A study ascertaining the available treated wastewater from the Moonta Community Wastewater Management System after the agreed allocation to the Dunes Golf Course, possibly supplemented by rain water tanks is being undertaken. We are also progressing a detailed Masterplan for the Moonta Town Hall, so that this important facility is better used as a vibrant community hub. In addition, a study is being undertaken for a Masterplan for the upgrade of McCauley Park to make this an even better place for local residents and tourists.

I would like to congratulate Wallaroo on being named South Australia's Small Tourist Town and People's Choice Award. Whilst we did not win the National Award it highlights that Wallaroo is a major tourist destination.

I would like to also congratulate the Mayor, Roslyn Talbot, the seven existing Councillors that have all been reelected unopposed and Andrew Male who has also been elected unopposed for the Council. We had eight nominations for the nine Councillor vacancies for the elections conducted by the Electoral Commission of South Australia. I look forward to working with the new Council.

Finally, it has been a busy but rewarding year. I trust and hope that you all have a safe and happy Christmas and New Year. I have appreciated working with so many clubs, organisations, businesses and the community in 2022 and I look forward to working with you all in 2023.

DOG AND CAT REGISTRATIONS

We had a total of 4381 dogs and cats due for registration renewals in the Copper Coast area as at 1 July 2022 and achieved 83% of these by the 31 August due date.

3044 dogs and 595 cats have been

registered, which ensures proof of ownership and a speedy return to owners if they are found wandering from their home.

There are still 341 dogs and 401 cats that are still to be renewed.

FOGO IN ACTION

Last financial year was our first full year under the Food Organics, Green Organics (FOGO) system (2021-22), and now we can compare those statistics with the last financial year before the system was introduced to residents (2020-21).

The stats show that while the total tonnage of waste streams collected actually increased across the year, the amount of general waste going to landfill was down by 1075.21 tonnes.

To put that into perspective, that's about the equivalent of 597 Holden Commodores, 43 full waste trucks, 98 of the world's heaviest elephants on record (10,886 kilograms) or 5 Boeing 747 jets—it's great to see the impact we're having on reducing waste and increasing recycling!

Thank you to our residents who have embraced the Organics system that continues to be implemented across the nation and don't forget to sign up to Take the Pledge for your chance to win prizes.

You may have noticed a slight change to next year's 2023 kerbside calendar on page 12. FOGO collection for Moonta, Moonta Mines, North Yelta and North Moonta will be on a Tuesday (not a Wednesday) each fortnight. FOGO collection for Moonta Bay and Port Hughes will stay on a Wednesday each fortnight.

TAKE THE PLEDGE WINNERS

Speaking of winning prizes, we've now had 12 winners in our Take the Pledge program take home a 6x4 trailerload of compost and a \$50 gift voucher to a local hardware store or nursery of their choice.


Each round runs for a two-month period, with one winner picked in each of the areas of Kadina, Moonta and Wallaroo (including surrounding areas). To be eligible to win each round, all you have to do is register to Take the Pledge. Wallaroo to Moonta shared path

The majority of the Wallaroo to Moonta Shared Path between Magazine and Mines Road is sealed and almost ready to go, as works have progressed to the ends of the path, line-marking and trail signage to come.

With only about 5km of path left to go, contractors are now on the job to carefully proceed through the Moonta Mines site (between Mines Road and the Moonta Tourist Office) and in Wallaroo (between Ryan Street and Magazine Road).



Agery/Roach Intersection

Council is currently focusing on its other projects across the Copper Coast while awaiting for SA Water to relay a water main that runs down Agery Road.

Contractors have made good progress on the Agery Road/Roach Street project, completing kerb preparation and replacement on both sides.

A new spoon drain at the Mines Road intersection, new side entry pit at the Agery Road/Roach Street intersection and the raising and repair of current pits on Roach Street have also been done to assist with stormwater flows.

Once SA Water complete their works, contractors can return to finish their intersection remediation works that will eliminate an existing spoon drain and remove the depression in the road, and both roads can be resealed.

GEORGE STREET

We're past the halfway mark for stormwater works along George Street as contractors return to the site.

Works were stopped during the school holidays to allow for smoother travel through Moonta's main street during the peak tourism period.

Stormwater has been upgraded and the road resealed from Henry Street intersection to halfway towards the Ellen Street intersection, where the final section of work will take place.

As works continue to progress along the road towards Ellen Street, rolling closed zones are to be used and kept minimal in size to allow traffic and parking up to the site fences. Each zone continues to be backfilled and opened to motorists before moving onto the next zone.

The installation of side entry pits, junction boxes and pipes across each zone will help minimise flooding within Moonta's CBD.





/ERRAN BACK GAIN

Verran Terrace, Moonta is back in one piece following repair works on a sinkhole which developed on the edge of the road near the corner of Shepherdson Road.

The cause of the sinkhole was a collapsing mine shaft, which has now been stablised with 50 cubic metres of stabilised sand.

Council workers and contractors excavated, filled, reconstructed and sealed the road based on guidelines provided by the engineers. Approximately 1600 cubic metres of loose spoil was excavated and removed from the Sinkhole.

Three layers of Geo Grid has been used in 3 separate locations/stages during the backfilling using controlled fill to compact and rehabilitate the soil while rebuilding the land back up to the normal level.

We thank residents and visitors for their patience and for using the detour that was in place, and are sorry for any inconvenience these works caused.



The Major Upgrade of Bay Road is set to be completed by the end of this month, with contractors Downer now just stablising and sealing the remaining two Stages.

The Stormwater upgrade across all sections has now been completed by contractors CME and Stage 3 of the road (Tossell Street to Highview Grove) is all sealed and ready to go.

Electrical conduits and water meter connections have also been installed continuously under Bay Road while each section was being worked on to ensure the new road surface is not disturbed once completed.

Once the remaining sections (Kitto Road to Highview Grove and Tossell Street to the ocean) have been stablised and sealed, line-marking and road signage will complete the project.

The major upgrade has been a long road of works from excavation, pipe laying and pit installation to backfilling, kerbing, median strips, stabilising and sealing the road and shared path.

We thank the residents and visitors for their patience during the project as contractors have dealt with collapsing sands and soft sub soils that have caused delays in this major upgrade.

A WINNING GARDEN

The community garden at the Kadina Memorial School has taken out this year's SA Healthy Towns Challenge award for outstanding efforts in promoting health and wellbeing within the community.

This project, along with 4 others across regional and rural South Australia, were funded up to \$50,000 each in the third round of Wellbeing SA's Healthy Towns Challenge.

As part of each funding round, one project that supported the greatest improvements in healthier living within their local community based on the criteria is selected as the winner by Wellbeing SA.

Led by the Kadina Memorial School in partnership with SOS Copper Coast Suicide Prevention Network and Copper Coast Council, this project involved contributions by more than 400 people across the community.

Local organisations, community groups and Nharangga Elders were involved to design, develop and sustain a natural garden environment for vegetables, native bush foods and meeting spaces to encourage social connection and support – both key protective factors against suicide.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

State Government grants are important as ever in the current climate as clubs have come out of COVID-19 restrictions and are now dealing with the increased cost of living. This is a reminder to all clubs that we are always here to help from assisting with budgeting and applying for grants to securing volunteers and updating policies.

When applying for grants, it is important to make sure you tick ALL the criteria. If you are not eligible or you have forgotten to submit vital pieces of information and still submit an application, valuable time and resources are wasted.

With funding and volunteers becoming harder to find, the SA Government is prioritising these areas. However, I continue to urge clubs who are struggling to consider merging before losing your club's identity altogether by folding.

The merging of sporting clubs and facilities enables the sharing of resources and sponsors. By utilising just one shared venue, imagine the savings clubs will have. Many clubs may be forced to fold if they do not have the resources behind them to survive into the future.

Despite COVID-19 impacts this past financial year, Sports Vouchers have still run hot on the Copper Coast. The Sports Vouchers program is a Government of South Australia initiative administered by the ORSR. The program provides an opportunity for primary school aged children from reception to Year 9 to receive up to \$100 discount on sports or dance membership/ registration fees and learn to swim programs. The purpose is to increase the number of children playing organised sport or participating in dance activities by reducing cost as a barrier.

That's our Disability Accessibility Widget we installed in late August – one of the first South Australian Councils to do so.


The UserWay Widget is the number one web accessibility solution for Web Content Accessibility Guidelines and is now installed across all pages on our website.

For your survival leave bushfire risk areas

The Fire Danger Season starts 15 November 2022 and ends 30 April 2023 (subject to change).

It is the responsibility of all land owners to ensure that their properties are kept in a condition that does not pose a potential fire risk for the duration of the Fire Danger Season.

Council's Fire Prevention Officer will be commencing inspections of properties in the Copper Coast early October. A section 105F notice will be issued under the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005 to those who have not cleared their properties.

Failing to comply with this notice will result in Council appointing contractors to clear blocks deemed at risk. In the event that Council has to engage a contractor on behalf of the owner, the costs incurred for a standard block could amount to about **\$750** (which includes contractor fees, expiation fees and handling fees). Contact details of contractors can be found on Council's website.

The new simplified Australian Fire Danger Safety Rating System is outlined above.

The system uses the latest science data and technology to improve the forecasting of fire danger while easily communicating to the community how dangerous a bushfire would be should one start and what to do to keep safe.
