The Copper Coast is fortunate to be serviced very well by educational institutions.

Residents on the Copper Coast have a choice of Child Care Centres, Preschools and many options in R-12 education.

The various public and private educational facilities cater to the needs of the diverse students we have on the Copper Coast.

Residents have a great opportunity to be able to choose the best option for them. Students have the option to pursue a VET pathway preparing them for the workforce or pathways which can lead to further education.

There are generally three paths that typical Year 12 leavers might take: Further study—whether it's University, TAFE or College; taking a year or two as a "gap year" to travel, or do other activities; or moving straight into a career.

The Copper Coast is serviced by a well-equipped TAFE. A TAFE that we have been lobbying the Government to offer more courses and provide more options to the community, an advocacy that we will continue. We see too many

people having to leave the area to receive the training they need to pursue their chosen career.

Copper Coast Council has recognised the impost placed on students wanting to pursue a University Degree. Many students have found the financial impost of having to move to the city too great and have had to put their dreams on hold. Some have ventured to the city, but the strain of adapting to a new lifestyle and education, away from home at a young age, has often proven too much and studies have not been completed.

It was with this in mind that the Copper Coast Council successfully lobbied for Federal Government funding to establish the Copper Coast Council University Centre. This funding will allow us to establish a University Centre within the current TAFE.

I am very proud to announce that University Courses will be provided in conjunction with Uni Hub Spencer Gulf from the first Semester in 2021.

It will allow students to study their chosen degree in a supportive environment, with access to technology and high-speed internet, administrative and academic support services as

well as pastoral support.

Caroline Perkins, Executive Director of the Regional Universities Network, says the best way to keep graduates in the regions is to train them in the regions. She said 7 out of 10 regional university graduates will go on to work in a regional area. In comparison, those who study in metropolitan Australia, only 2 out of 10 will work in a regional area.

I believe education is the most important tool you can receive that can bring you the most success in society today. Education lessens the challenges you will face in life.

The more knowledge you gain, the more opportunities will open up, allowing individuals to achieve better possibilities in career and personal growth.

The addition of the University Centre will be an excellent inclusion to the already existing education facilities in the Copper Coast. These ensure our youth have every opportunity to pursue their dreams and remain as residents of the Copper Coast, where they will continue to contribute and help the Copper Coast retain the *Lifestyle Location of Choice* we all enjoy.

CEO's Update...

The Council tries to progress and achieve a variety of projects throughout the Council area within its budget. The projects being progressed with Federal Government funding from the Round 2 Drought Communities Programme – Extension are as follows:- Moonta Town Hall, Wallaroo Town Hall, Kadina Lagoons, Kadina CBD Audio/Smart Technology, Cemetery Management, Wallaroo Illuminart and Paskeville Water Storage. All of these projects are required to be completed by 31st December 2020, except the Cemetery Management, which needs to be finalised by 30th June 2021.

Council also will receive \$25,000 from Legatus for the Copper Coast Otago Road Dune Stabilisation and a further \$50,000 will be received from the State Government to assist with the Bicycle/Walking trail from Moonta to Moonta Bay as part of the Bay Road upgrade.

Approval has been received from the Federal Government under the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure for the following projects:- Moonta Town Hall, Bay Road Moonta Bay, Moonta Masterplan & Council and Tourism Signage. The funding for these projects total \$412,199. These projects are required to be completed by 30th June 2021.

A Funding Agreement has been finalised with the Federal Government for the provision of University courses from the Kadina TAFE as the Copper Coast Council University Centre. Council will receive \$1,114,960 over a 3 year period for the provision of these courses. The University courses will be provided in conjunction with

Uni Hub Spencer Gulf. The University Centre will be staffed by a Chief Executive Officer (shared with Uni Hub Spencer Gulf), Centre Coordinator (employed by Council), part-time student Support Officer (employed by Council), Communication Support Officer (shared with Uni Hub Spencer Gulf) and Tutors. The first University courses will be offered from the first semester in 2021. We are also working with TAFE SA for the necessary fit out to enable the operation of the University Centre from TAFE SA in Kadina.

In relation to the Wallaroo Swimming Enclosure, the Council had a contract with Sea-Slip, who subcontracted the project to three subcontractors. The Council has been trying to progress a commercial resolution and a financial settlement with five parties;

including Council – dealing with five Solicitors, four insurance companies, four businesses and a mediator. This is complex, difficult and time consuming, but is being progressed as quickly as possible at the least cost. It is possible that the resolution and financial settlement will take up to 24 months. Within this time, Council will commence community engagement to obtain the views of all interested persons, organisations and businesses to provide an opportunity to have input into an aquatic facility at Wallaroo. Once agreement has been reached on an aquatic facility, this will be designed and costed. Information is also being obtained concurrently on all of the necessary approvals, legal and risk requirements regarding a possible swimming jetty.

Once financial settlement is reached, Council will also use its best endeavours to obtain additional Federal and State funding for the facility at Wallaroo. It is desired for there to be the very best aquatic facility in Wallaroo, as agreed to by the community, to stand the test of time.

Council recognises that roads, footpaths and stormwater drainage are important services for residents in the Copper Coast Council. A draft Five Year Transport Plan outlining the various roads proposed to be resealed, reconstructed, resheeted together with footpaths and stormwater drainage are listed for comment on Council's website.

Further, information through Council's website is being updated every month outlining the Council works proposed and being undertaken on roads, footpaths, stormwater drainage, parks, capital works and projects. This is to better inform everyone of work being undertaken by Council.

Council has been a successful participant in the Regional Airports Program grant funding, receiving \$104,000 for the upgrade of the Kadina Airport, which will benefit the Royal Flying Doctors Service and Country Fire Service Water Bombers.

Council will commence improvement

works in October, with completion scheduled in November.

The project scope includes;

- 1 Re-sealing and strengthening of the existing taxiway parking area (3250m²).
- 2 Minor stormwater improvements to alleviate localised flooding and improve performance of taxiway parking areas.
- 3 Construction of a new sealed taxiway parking area to improve safety and efficiencies (450m²).

All works will be undertaken to minimise any inconvenience to the Kadina Aerodrome users.

Copper Coast Council is thrilled to announce submissions are now open for the community to showcase their creativity during the Wallaroo Silo Light Show.

For each seasonal show, there will be a new theme where the community can submit photos, videos, words and drawings to be illuminated onto the silos, or even sounds and music to accompany the show.

The theme of the grand opening show will be “Copper Coast - Through Your Eyes”, where residents and visitors can express through their submissions how

they view the region.

Council will select submitted content to work into the show, which must be taken or created locally, but if a submission doesn't make it, it may feature in a future show.

The submission process is simple:

- Follow the prompts, upload your content and hit submit.

Only digital content will be accepted,

therefore, if artwork is to be displayed, it must be scanned, photographed or videoed, then submitted.

A permanent projection structure was created, with the help of illuminart, for regular showings due to the success of the Travelling Light Show illuminating the Wallaroo Silos in August 2019.

This is one of the seven Drought Communities Programme – Extension – Round 2 projects the Federal Government has helped fund.

Submissions for the opening show close 31st October 2020.

WALLAROO TO MOONTA TRAIL

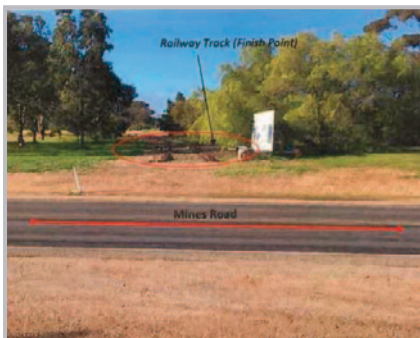
Council has determined their preferred route for the proposed Wallaroo to Moonta Walking Trail following the 2nd September 2020 Council Meeting.

The proposed trail would run approximately 14.9 kilometres alongside the old railway track, with one end beginning across from Ryan Street in Wallaroo, connecting with the existing Copper Coast Rail Trail between Wallaroo and Kadina.

The trail would continue alongside Ryan Street, then Cornish Terrace, Park Terrace and Magazine Road, before travelling alongside an unnamed road.

After a slight turn near Coota Road, the proposed trail would run alongside Spencer Highway and cross Mines Road to continue off-road, following the railway line before finishing on Mines Road, near the entrance to Moonta.

Council is obtaining the use of these portions of land before proceeding with design, costing and securing grant funding for the works.



North Beach Sand Drift Strategy



The hard work of the North Beach Sand Drift Strategy has been implemented, and now we monitor Mother Nature's actions.

Fencing has been installed and thousands of native plants have been planted, which should reduce sand from building up beyond the beach and affecting beachfront properties.

The idea behind the three rows of fencing is for sand dunes to form over them to reduce the velocity of the wind, the small gaps in between each section are there to form a pathway (as

displayed in the diagrams above).

Council and our consultants, Succession Ecology, will regularly monitor and manage sand movements and continue to irrigate plantings as the sand dunes form.

In the meantime, we ask members of the public to stay out of the flagged off areas and use the thoroughfares provided as pedestrian traffic may cause failure of the project.

More native plants will be planted on the sand dunes once they're built up over the sand drift fences.



COPPER COAST READS

Coping with lifestyle changes over the past few months has inspired many to re-evaluate priorities and given us time to re-engage with simple pleasures.

Copper Coast Libraries successfully continued to offer services throughout the changing COVID-19 restrictions. From late March until 30th June, not only were the community able to continue accessing the collection through Click & Collect and Drop & Wave, but the online children sessions attracted over 20,000 views, the free to access eCollection (books, audio, magazines and newspapers) over 5,400 loans and over 172,000 Facebook page views.

Now the doors are open again, programs have resumed with some modifications and the community is encouraged to re-engage.

Australia Reads will be a 12-day celebration of reading, commencing 1st November and culminating in the Australia Reading Hour on November 12th.

Take the opportunity to visit the Kadina, Moonta or Wallaroo Libraries and re-engage with reading.



The Splash Town 2020-21 season opening has been postponed due to COVID-19 restrictions on Public Activity in South Australia.

We understand the impact on families and visitors, however, the health and safety of our community is first priority.

While current directives required to be followed by users and staff of the facility are



impractical to maintain, we will keep up-to-date with the latest COVID-19 updates from the State Government.

We will announce season opening dates to this FREE to use community water park once the road to recovery from COVID-19 becomes clearer, restrictions ease and we feel it is safe to open Splash Town to the public.

Council has prepared for its reopening down the track, with four new shade sails installed – a project part of the \$1 million funding Council received under the Australian Government's Drought Communities Programme - Extension.

Families can now worry less about the sun's harsh UV rays and more about simply having fun.



VICTORIA SQUARE, KADINA

The new paved plaza on the corner of Graves and Digby Street catches the eye in the Kadina CBD.

With garden beds, multiple trees planted and a pathway leading into the heart of Victoria Square, the park certainly gives more of a welcoming feeling to visitors.

The works to make Victoria Square a hub for the whole community continues, with plans to install further seating, featuring Wi-Fi and mobile charging stations.



FRANCES TERRACE, MOONTA

Frances Terrace is coming along nicely with stormwater, lighting electrical and kerbing installed in stages 1, 2 and 3.

Stages 4 and 5, alongside Caroline Street and Milne Terrace, are still in progress as works continue towards the Milne Terrace roundabout.

In the next month, stages 4 and 5 will be completed, allowing shaping, stabilisation and bitumen works to be done across all stages.

Council urges motorists to drive attentively and to the road rules when negotiating road closures and detours during this time.

Kadina Cemetery Wall Update

The delicate process of preserving the Kadina Cemetery Walls continues with contractors moving along the front of the Southern Wall.

It's been an extensive process with each damaged stone and brick pulled out, replaced, shaped and plastered back into the wall.

It took 18 months to complete the Eastern and Western walls, and this one is taking a little bit longer due its deterioration. We're running low on locally sourced limestone and sludge miner's bricks, so if anyone has a contact, please call Council.

Council is committed to making sure the materials of our heritage-listed Cemetery continue to remain within the Copper Coast.

Revegetation of the inside of the cemetery walls with a consistent planting theme will follow the completion of the wall repair.



KADINA LAGOONS

Works on the Kadina Lagoons are complete, with two new lagoons installed, lined, tested, certified, online and filled.

During excavations, more than 3,600 tonnes of limestone reuse material was collected and crushed, which can be used in our rural re-

sheeting program to fix and repair dirt roads.

A pump station has been installed and commissioned and the anchor trenches for the lagoon liners have been backfilled.

Access roads around the lagoons are also complete.



NORTH BEACH TOILETS

The aged toilet facilities adjacent to the Wallaroo Holiday Park and North Beach Kitchen are set to be demolished and replaced with an improved, modernised design of similar stylings to the one situated at Moonta's Ellen Street Carpark.



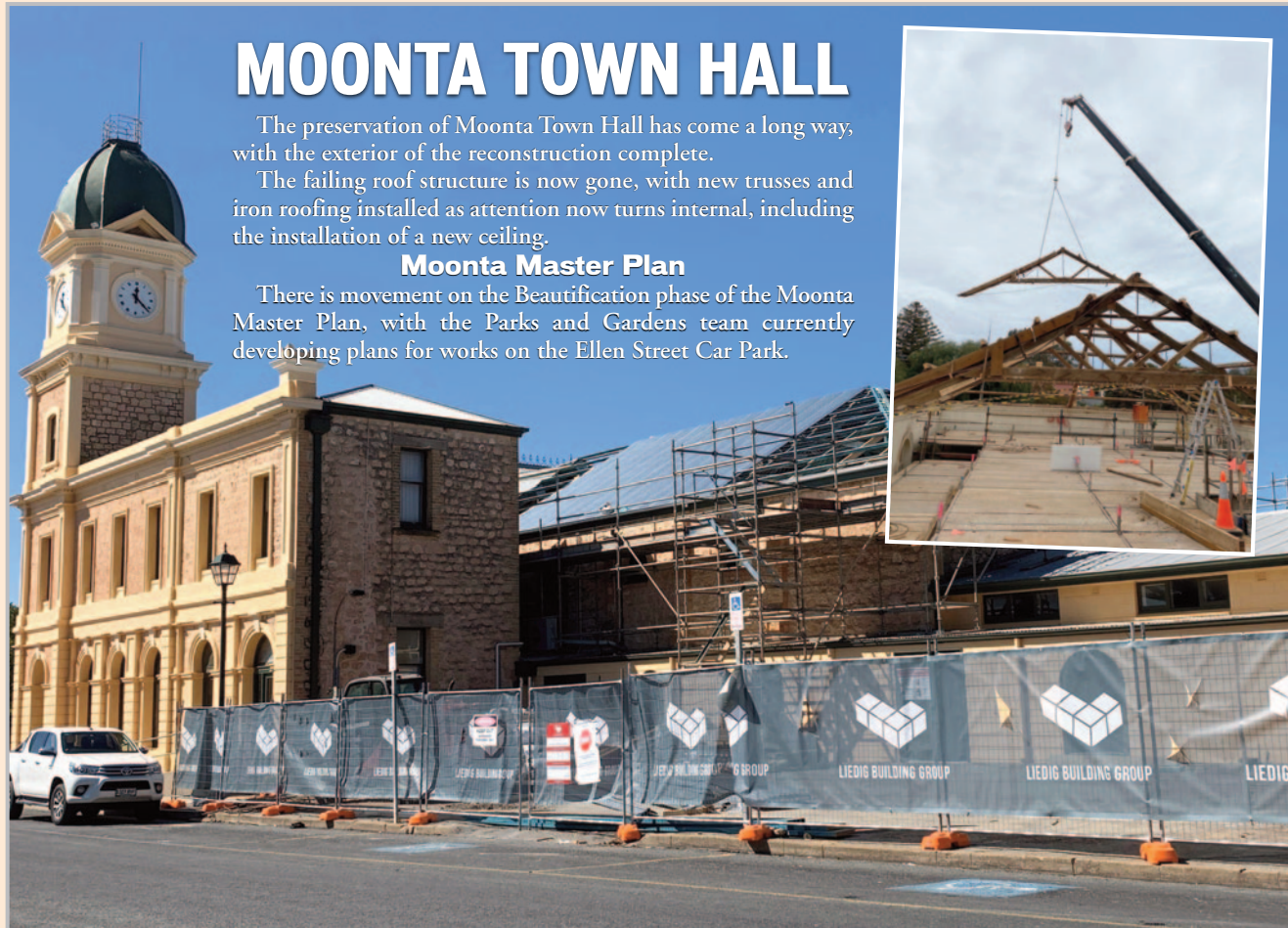
MOONTA TOWN HALL

The preservation of Moonta Town Hall has come a long way, with the exterior of the reconstruction complete.

The failing roof structure is now gone, with new trusses and iron roofing installed as attention now turns internal, including the installation of a new ceiling.

Moonta Master Plan

There is movement on the Beautification phase of the Moonta Master Plan, with the Parks and Gardens team currently developing plans for works on the Ellen Street Car Park.



Wallaroo Town Hall

The Wallaroo Town Hall is not missing out on the attention, with plans being finalised to move the external toilets inside.

The new toilet facilities will also feature an upgraded accessible toilet with all the

necessary requirements, while the supper room will receive a touch-up.

Air conditioning for the hall is also being scoped and costed to make the Wallaroo Town Hall a hub for events and meetings all-year round.



Wallaroo Dog Park

Works on the Wallaroo Dog Park on Heritage Drive have begun with fencing now surrounding the area.

Interest has now moved to the inside of the facility, where

there will be plenty of obstacles and a refreshment area for the dogs.

Owners will also have plenty of shade and benches to watch their best friend in comfort.



Mayor Roslyn Talbot is encouraging Copper Coast residents to show their support for small businesses in their local communities for a nationwide campaign.

The “Go Local First” campaign, an initiative of the Council of Small Business Organisations Australia (COSBOA), will highlight the vital role of small businesses in our nation’s economic recovery from COVID-19 and keeping local communities thriving.

“Since the Go Local First Campaign was nationally launched, we’ve been working closely with Moonta Traders Group, Wallaroo Community Development Association and Kadina Hub to implement this campaign in their communities with their local businesses,” Mayor Talbot said.

“It’s been great to see how they’ve embraced

this campaign and shown great enthusiasm with creative ideas in how to promote the campaign.”

The campaign will encourage Australians to choose local small businesses when they are purchasing products and services to help get the economy back on its feet.

Small businesses account for just over one-third of Australia’s gross domestic product and an economic recovery will not be possible without small businesses trading and hiring people.

“Throughout this pandemic, small businesses have done it tough,” Mayor Talbot said.

“Now is the time to be out supporting the Copper Coast’s local grocers, butchers, restaurants, cafes, accounting and legal firms, gardeners, tradespeople, and food producers.

“Our local small businesses need our loyal communities to back them now, by ‘going local first’ when they need to buy a product or service.

“When you shop locally, your money stays in the community, meaning local jobs and local economies not just surviving, but helping them to thrive as we emerge from COVID-19.

“Australia’s 3.5 million small businesses are the heartbeat of local communities, when they thrive, communities thrive, and the national economy prospers.”

Research commissioned by COSBOA shows Australians are spending more at local businesses since the COVID-19 lockdowns began earlier this year, but temporary and permanent closures are preventing them from doing more to support them.

“Now is the time for locals to support locals and I know our businesses will show why they deserve the support,” Mayor Talbot said.

“Recovery doesn’t happen in one week, it will take time for businesses to recover.”

“As we move forward, they will need your continued support as this needs to be a long-term initiative.”

The research finds Australians see broad economic improvements as the most important issue for the country, after managing the spread of the coronavirus.

The Go Local First campaign will be rolled out on outdoor, radio, and digital advertising for another three months with a call to action to consumers to spend locally first.

FOGO (food organics and green organics)

Council are in the process of reviewing its current Kerbside Collection program in conjunction with Federal and State Government’s vision to promote sustainability of waste that can be recycled. To gain a better understanding of the community’s knowledge on waste, Council recently circulated two surveys, one for businesses and one for residents.

In total, 19 businesses and 286 residents completed the surveys. The consensus was roughly 50/50 have heard about FOGO (food organics green organics), however, little to no knowledge of what the system is. Of the responses received, half knew about the cost implications of FOGO going to landfill and 98.6% of people are in support of

Council moving to a FOGO System with the use of a kitchen caddy in the home.

Council will now investigate the practice of a FOGO System to be potentially implemented in the households of the Copper Coast in the near future.

As part of Council’s pledge to start reducing the quantity of waste ending in landfill, staff are being educated through a new waste system in place across our Kadina office and Library.

The program indicates what can be recycled, repurposed and composted with a variety of different bins.

To help educate the community further, we have been publishing regular recycling tips on our Facebook page.

BUSHFIRE PREVENTION

The Fire Danger Season starts 15th November 2020 and ends 30th April 2021 (subject to change).

It is the responsibility of all land owners to ensure that their properties are kept in a condition that does not pose a potential fire risk for the duration of the Fire Danger Season.

Council's Fire Prevention Officer will be commencing inspections of properties in the Copper Coast early October. A section 105F notice will be issued under the Fire and Emergency

Services Act 2005 to those who have not cleared their properties.

Failing to comply with this notice will result in Council appointing contractors to clear blocks deemed at risk.

In the event that Council has to engage a contractor on behalf of the owner, the costs incurred for a standard block could amount to about \$570 (which includes contractor fees, expiation fees and handling fees). Contact details of contractors can be found on Council's website.

The two-day event involved a road race on the outskirts of Wallaroo and a Criterium race in the town centre of Moonta.

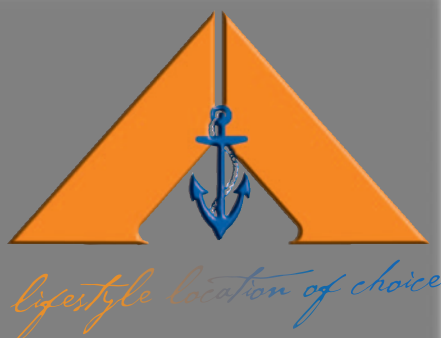
Individuals and teams of cyclists came from all over South Australia to participate and to enjoy the region. A highlight for some racers was the off-road gravel route from the Wallaroo
