

The centre was formed in 2005 by a small group who converted an old disused fish factory which had been taken over by pigeons and with the assistance of grants from the Federal Government, the council of the copper coast and local and overseas businessmen have turned it into a modern centre where members and visitors can make use of the many facilities and group functions which are available here.

Dedicated to all those members who served in any conflict in the world it is intended to provide a quiet social gathering place for any who wish to participate in the various activities available or just to wander through the museum or the Memorial Garden.

Counselors are available for those who need assistance in making any pension claims.

Various groups in the centre also provide an outlet for members who feel a creative urge be it in material, steel or wood. From time to time various outings for fishing, crabbing, or visiting other places are organized to involve members.

The centre has been described by the Federal Minister of veterans' Affairs as a shining example of what veterans can achieve with a little help and organization.

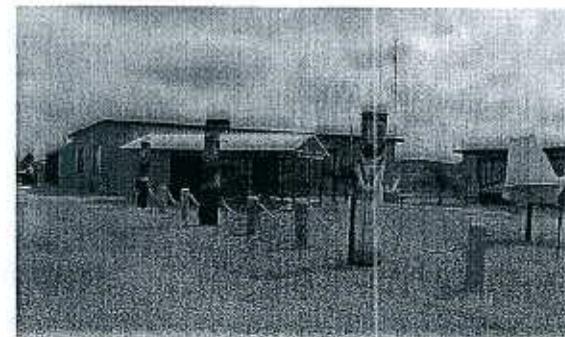

At the front of the centre is the Rose Garden dedicated to servicemen who have passed on and many have had their ashes scattered among the roses to lie peacefully with their mates.



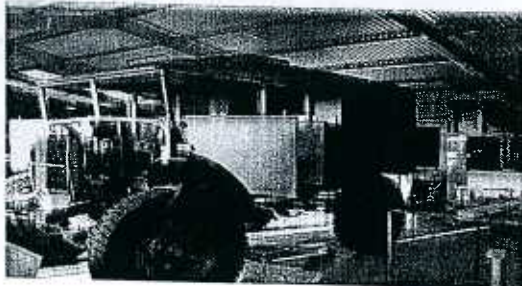


Ray Robinson Memorial Military Museum:

This museum was built using Government Grants and council assistance and now houses a fine collection of World War 1 and 11 and Vietnam military memorabilia. This collection is continually being added to by the work of the centre's restoration workshops and donations from veterans. Entry by gold coin donation.

Restoration Workshop:

It is here that members restore various military items from a WW1 Field cannon to a WW11 Gun tractor and jeep. Firearms are also restored and reactivated for later display. In addition much of the outdoor dining area's red gum furniture was made here. Members can also use the machinery and expertise of the workshop to aid them in their own personal projects.



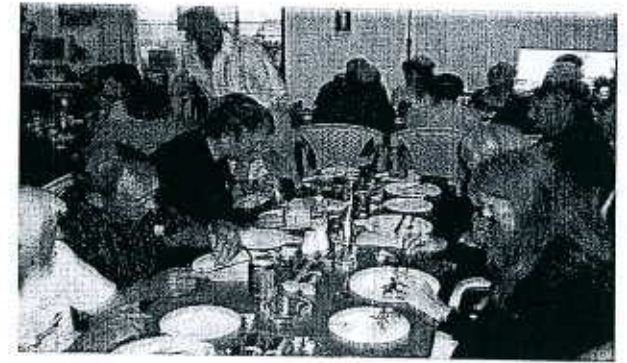

Dining Room Areas:

The main indoor dining area has capacity to seat 60 diners and has a fully equipped kitchen/servery together with well appointed toilets. Opening from the rear of the dining room is a large outdoor dining area complete with polished red gum tables, a bar and large barbeque with seating for 40 more.
