Kerbside Collection to include New Greenwaste Collection

Council is introducing a Greenwaste Kerbside Collection service which will be included as part of the rates from January 2020. The collection will be monthly and Residents are required to purchase their own bin to join this service.

The inclusion of the green waste service will be a great addition to the already existing collection services, and look to reduce

almost 900 tonnes from landfill yearly (based on prior figures).

Please ensure the specified bin listed below is purchased to avoid your bin not being collected. To find out which days your Greenwaste bin will be collected, please see the 2020 Recycling Calendar page 12 of this issue.



Specifications

The specifications of the bin are:

- Dark green body with lime green lid
- 240 litre capacity
- Manufactured in accordance with Australian standards (AS4123 and EN840)
- Resistant to UV degradation
- Resistant to decay, frost, heat and chemicals
- Tolerant of mechanical handling during road side pick-up



What can go in?

As this is a greenwaste collection service, the only streams of waste that can enter this bin are:

- Small prunings and cuttings
- Lawn clippings and weeds
- Flowers and leaves
- Bark, Small twigs and branches (no bigger than 15cm in diameter)
- Seaweed and sweepings

Drought Funding



The Council has received approval for \$1M for drought funding projects to stimulate the economy. The funding is subject to the Federal Government criteria to benefit particularly local businesses and Contractors. The Council has approved the following projects:

- Moonta Bay Splash Town Shade Cover and Repairs
- The establishment of Dog Parks at Wallaroo, Kadina and Moonta
- Cemetery Wall and Cemetery Repairs at Kadina and Moonta Cemeteries
- · Beautification and Upgrade of Wallaroo Council Land
- Upgrade of Timaru Park, North Beach
- The construction and installation of a Beach Access Ramp Johnsons Cove, Port Hughes
- Kadina Treatment Pond Lagoon Liner
- Repair Wallaroo Breakwater
- Copper Coast Drought Support Dinner
- The construction of a new 7 Bay Shed for the Moonta Community Activity Centre
- Copper Coast Sport & Leisure Centre Repairs and Acoustic/Sound Upgrade
- Installation of Charging Stations for Electric Mobility Scooters at Wallaroo, Moonta and Kadina
- Undertake Tree Trimming on Rural Roads

The Federal Government advised on the 16th September 2019 that all of these projects have been approved. The projects are required to be completed by the 30th June 2020.

Economic Development and **Marketing Plan**

The Council commissioned Parallax to prepare an Economic Development and Marketing Plan for Council. Following discussions with businesses, organisations and residents a draft Plan was produced with Actions. The Action titles were Brand Affirmation, Tourism, Health, Generate Investment and Education. The draft Plan was subject to any comments from businesses, organisations, people that contributed to the Plan and the public. On 7th August 2019 Council adopted the Economic Development and Marketing Plan which will continue to drive the growth and prosperity for the Copper Coast Council. We will ensure that every six months there is a report to Council on implementing the actions in the Plan.

Upper Spencer Gulf University Hub at Kadina

Copper Coast Council together with the Upper Spencer Gulf University Hub at Port Pirie, RDA Yorke and Mid North and other key stakeholders are progressing the consideration of a node of this University Hub in the Copper Coast Council area based at Kadina.

A Steering Committee with Businesses, Government, Community and Council representatives has been formed to progress this initative. Further information will be provided as this is progressed.



Snapper Closure

The Council lodged a submission with the State Government highlighting the significant economic and community impact the proposed State Government Snapper Closure on fishing will have on the Copper Coast Tourism and businesses in particular. It is understood that the State Government have imposed a three year ban on the fishing for Snapper from 1st November 2019.


The Moonta Masterplan Survey recently closed, after being extended for almost 2 weeks, as per a request by the Moonta Business Traders Group in August. In total, 437 responses were received, which is a good indicator of the level of interest in this much loved township. The next stage of the process is to use the input from the survey to formulate a draft Framework that will be presented to Council. More to come as this project advances.

Port Hughes Foreshore Landscape

As part of the development approval for the Port Hughes boat ramp upgrade, landscape works on the upper section of the boat ramp carpark were completed in August.

Works included a vegetated and formed batter between the carpark and upper level, garden bed between the bike track adjacent Minnie Terrace and the reserve and fencing to highlight overflow parking during peak periods.











Cemetery Stone Wall Restoration

Restoration works are progressing on the Kadina Cemetery Wall, with the focus now on the Eastern outside wall. Repairs have continued throughout the month.

In addition to the works, Council has applied for a heritage grant to help further develop this project, together with the Moonta Cemetery Wall and a Cemetery Master Plan. The grant is through round two of the SA Heritage Grants initiative.

Community volunteers continue to assist with this project.

Victoria Square Update

- Tenders have been awarded to Contractors to upgrade and reconfigure the irrigation and electrical within Victoria Square between Digby and Ewing Streets.
- Restoration works on the Rotunda have progressed with the balustrade removed, repaired and reinstated.
- Council is communicating developments with the Rotary Club of Northern Yorke Peninsula to ensure the Rotary Kadina Markets and future infrastructure supports ongoing activities within the park.

Copper Coast Welcomes Cruise Ships

Cruise & Maritime Voyages Australia (CMV) will be the world's first cruise line to visit Wallaroo this summer. CMV's newest ship Vasco da Gama will visit Wallaroo in addition to Port Lincoln and Kangaroo Island providing passengers with the opportunity to experience the Copper Coast.

The Vasco da Gama will visit 3 times this season on Saturday 7th December, Wednesday 18th December and Friday 3rd January. The ship will dock at 8am each visit with differing departure times due to the tides.

1200 passengers and 600 crew will have the opportunity to participate in tours, local markets & entertainment, shopping and dining providing an economic benefit to the area.

Community members and visitors are encouraged to come to Wallaroo to not only see the ship in port but to experience all that is being offered.

Copper Coast Visitor Information Centre staff have been working hard to prepare for the visits. Markets (coordinated by NYP Rotary Club) will be held on all 3 dates at the John Terrace Reserve, Wallaroo with live entertainment programmed throughout each day.

Local tours will be available throughout the region and can be booked either on the ship through Intercruises, in person at the pop-up Visitor Information Centre at the Old



Railway Station, Wallaroo or online through www.visitcoppercoast.com.au

Shuttle buses will bring passengers who don't wish to walk along our picturesque jetty to and from the ship directly into John Tce which will act as the gateway to the Copper Coast. Between Town Shuttles will connect Wallaroo, Moonta and Kadina.

Bushfire prevention

Fire Danger Season – 15th November 2019 -30th April 2020 (subject to change). Now is the time to take pre-emptive action if you haven't already done so, to ensure that your property is cleared prior to the commencement of the fire danger season and is maintained to the required standard for the duration of the season.

At this time of year vegetation can become overgrown, creating fire hazards. In order to reduce the potential danger until the expiry of the fire danger season:

- Properties under one hectare in area all undergrowth must be maintained at or below 10cm in height
- Properties over one hectare in area -

establish and maintain a fire break around the whole area, placed as near as practicable to the perimeter. The fire break shall be at least a 5 metre wide strip in which all grass, pest plants and undergrowth is reduced to a maximum of 10 centimetres.

Council's Fire Prevention Officer has recently sent out reminder letters to property owners. Inspections of properties in the Copper Coast will commence early October 2019. If these properties have not been cleared a Section 105F notice will be issued with 21 days to rectify. Council then has the right to remove or reduce a fire hazard on private land and recoup the costs from the property owner and issue an expiation notice.
